Action Items from December 1, 2021

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SMPTE Trailers

The industry is planning to shift to all SMPTE-DCP trailers. The date is now set to be February 4, 2022. At this time the trailers will be in SMPTE-DCP simple version.

On February 4 Deluxe will distribute "Trail-Mix" hard drive in the SMPTE-DCP format. Other distribution companies are planning to do similar.

The InterSociety Ken Mason Award will be given to Jackie Brenneman and Esther Brauh in recognition of everything they have done for the cinema community. Award will be given at the dinner on January 18.

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ISDCF Immersive Audio

Is it time for a plugfest? Possible critical listening in January 2022, initial feedback from many is "not yet."

While it would be good to get test material to exercise RDD57, it doesn't seem that sufficient new rendering solutions have entered the marketplace since we did the last IAB plugfest.

It would be good to test authoring solutions, but we don't see immediate support from these tool manufacturers.

There is some interest in testing interface protocols - specifically 430-14 and 430-17, but these have not been published by SMPTE and again, we don't find a group of manufacturers that are pushing for testing.

DCI is planning on publishing new information related to SMPTE interface protocols. This may encourage a plugfest in the future.

The usual question: Has anyone implemented new features in IAB devices that others have implemented that need to be part of an IAB profile 2? (Nope)

We are still "on-hold" to change the name from "ATMOS" to "IAB" in the CTT (Content Title Text - AKA the Naming Convention) of the name. This could be a good EDCF/ISDCF discussion.

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Training

What is needed in the industry? Specifically, who needs training? Entry level? Mid-management? Executives?

- 1) Training of the operators (create a good audio/video experience)
- 2) Training of the technical Personnel (those that maintain equipment)

Current training is too in-depth for operator level.

- One great introduction is to start with the naming convention and see if you understand what each field means and can respond accordingly.
- Bite sized video is only way to communicate to non-technical
- Start with a "hot" topic and grow from there.

Learning about a complex theatrical system is far more than bite size videos.

Maybe ISDCF can be an aggregator of links for training - both bite size and long versions.

Can we identify a specific need? (Much like the “start with a hot topic” comment) and ISDCF could seek others to provide an approach to training.

Could ISDCF / ICTA hold a plug-fest for training?

Making training videos difficult since each facility has different operating methodology and equipment. No general solutions.

One company targets mid managers and believes this will “trickle down” to the line workers.

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What about 3D

ISO has a standard moving forward for 3D light levels based on SMPTE 432-1. Probably to be published in early 2022.

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DCP Testing Tools

Very difficult to get open source solution and it's not clear that there is a “gold standard” for what's correct. It might be too expensive to try and build a solution.

ISDCF successfully conducted SMPTE-DCP plugfests in the past and they identified specific tool issues, and it was a good way to make improvements.

Vendors should / can discuss incompatibilities. When an incompatibility is discovered, the vendors involved in the incompatibility should determine which side is not following the standard and make a correction. If the standard is unclear, an issue should be posted to the SMPTE GitHub for that standard and an agreement on interpretation should be attempted between the vendors.

If a system doesn't know what to do, DON'T CRASH!

NO SYSTEM SHOULD CRASH WHEN AN UNEXPECTED ELEMENT IN A DCP IS FOUND. It doesn't need to try to play it, but it shouldn't CRASH.

There was no strong need expressed by the community to build special testing tools, so we will drop this as a topic.

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SMPTE update

LMT (Language Metadata Table). The ISDCF language repository works well for digital cinema, but would not work for others (like IMF) or other downstream delivery. Conclusion: ISDCF keep doing our thing. Someday (but not anytime soon) we could embrace LMT. We don't plan on submitting ISDCF language repository to SMPTE.

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Updated Test Package

LOTS OF WORK NECESSARY! Still in the queue. We expect to create a GitHub repository for this work.

Biggest need is to create a RDD-57 package to show playability (and also RDD-52 compliant)

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Website and IT updates

All good. More Facilities and Studios have been added. Some new languages have been added.

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ISDCF Terminology Document

ICTA is working on a terminology / glossary document. ISDCF will help host the registry for a joint effort. We are waiting for the first batch of entries from ICTA to start the effort.

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EDCF Update

CinemaCon in April. Re-started work on SMPTE Roll Out.

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DCI update

The DCI document DCSS - Digital Cinema System Specification is now being published in HTML on line. A vast improvement for document maintenance.

The DCI is in process of updating the CTP (Compliance Test Plan) and will include IAB testing as well. DCI is reaching out to manufacturers for input to the next CTP. Please contact DCI if you want to have input.
