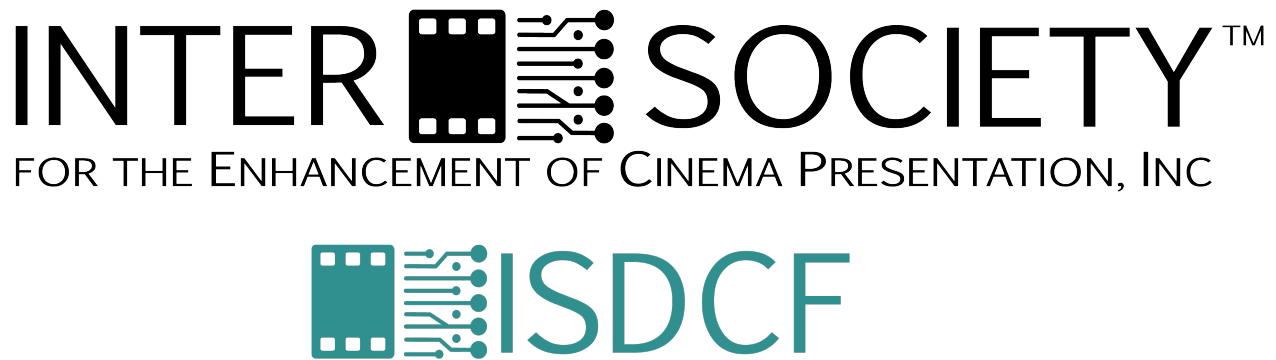

Action Items from March 27, 2025

1. Post the DCP for the ISDCF Audio Test content Version 2 for distribution
2. On a re-encode for version 3 of the test content, lower the “claps” and other segments (not the piano/Patriot) by at least 3db
3. Write up an expectation [Google document](#) that explains each of the segments of the test content.
4. Start a small group to add to the audio test content expectation document.
5. Hold a discussion to formalize the workflow for naming convention physical addresses.
6. Provide feedback to SMPTE on the posted journal articles.

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NATO (National Association of Theater Owners) has a new name: “Cinema United” We will see it next week at CinemaCon!



About 1/2 the room did not know that NATO has changed it's name.

We *think* the mission statement is the same for the new **Cinema United** organization.

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Audio Test Material

Earlier today we held a demonstration of the new Audio Test Content. We alternated between the two rooms at Deluxe. One room has an LED screen installed and the other a traditional projection perforated screen. We played a number of the segments by playing in one room then moving to the other room and listening to the same segment. We went back and forth about 8 times.

The new content has four new sections: 1) with pink noise moving around the room 2) a new Patriot clip with significant use of surrounds 3) the same new Patriot clip with the center channels mute and only the surrounds in use 4) a set of calibration tones for all channels.

One note to fix: the “clap” sequences were too loud and should be reduced by 3 to 6db. One person suggested that the piano and the Patriot scenes were at correct volume, but all the other test segments were 3db too loud.

The general conclusion was that the test material was excellent for revealing issues with screens of all types. It was interesting that some felt the claps were the best part, others the piano and others the Patriot clips. It's great that we have all the sections in the test!!

We believe that we need to create a "what to listen for" document that describes each section and what to expect. We will create an open [Google Doc](#) for people to add comments. We could add closed caption on the content describing what we expect. We will start from the comments that Brian Vessa made when creating content.

Plan to create an small group to create these comments.

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DCI Issued CTP (compliance test plan) update

CTP from 1.4.1 to 1.4.2. Noted as a minor update with no impactful changes.

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BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) updates

AKA Caption device plugfest. A meeting is being planned for a new committee ISCAF (InterSociety for Cinema Accessibility Forum). Let [Howard Kiedaisch](#) or [Jerry Pierce](#) know if you want to participate in the meeting.

A question was asked based on our plugfest last cycle: Is what we heard/saw long term acceptable as a solution for BYOD?

Is the HI track playback we heard acceptable. Short answer: NO. It MUST be better alignment with the audio. It was too far out of sync from the audio in the room. It MUST be frame accurate to be a long term (possible replacement for existing in-theater) solution.

Is the closed caption solution acceptable in the long term? Short answer: NO. The devices had too much scattered light and would not be as good a solution as could be provided by in-glass solutions that were once offered by Sony and might be part of an AR (augmented reality glasses) solution going forward. The current custom-built solutions offered protection against scattered light.

Most felt the Descriptive Track and the Sign Language track was acceptable for long term solutions. (With the understanding that the scattered light from the sign language track was still an issue.)

Chairman still feels that a synchronization solution is needed to enable these solutions.

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On Screen Text Rendering

Dean offered to form a committee to have the discussion for a long term solution / requirements for moving forward.

From Harold Hallikainen : I think the long term solution is to obey the font file, including vertical metrics. I agree on authoring font file. Current font compressors remove vertical metrics.

Still needed, no work has been done on this topic.

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Global SMPTE Roll out

Many in Asia are still using InteropDCP. Korea / Thailand - No update this time.

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Image Artifact issues (playback issues)

No update for ISDCF, keep on list. There are meetings held by some that “talk about this problem” often. It won’t solve the problem, but it means that ISDCF doesn’t need to start a new effort.

Some legacy equipment exhibits serious playback failures (including crashes) that seem to be the result of a defect in the playback system (it is not an error in the JPEG2000 bit stream). The problem is repeatable, but it will take serious investigation to determine the trigger for the problem. Since the equipment is legacy there is not much (any?) effort being applied to find the problem. The resources needed to solve this problem has not been assigned.

None of the recently deployed systems exhibit these problems, only legacy equipment. This is part of the bigger issue of what to do with legacy equipment that has problems with playback and certs. At some point of time these legacy devices might not be supported by new content, i.e. no KDM issued, since playback of content on this devices are unreliable. Unfortunately there are up to 40% of installed systems that are in this legacy category.

The industry COULD gather some legacy equipment in a location / facility for testing. We might just need to continue to live with the problem.

It MIGHT help if new CTP test content included content that better stress-tests decoders. But that would not solve the installed base problem.

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End-of-Life Playback issues

Yet again, some new CERTs have expired were not able to play them. Nothing for us to do. Known problem, known solutions (get your system upgraded for software fix. There may be a problem with some systems that can not be upgraded).

ISDCF may want to add a service to more officially publish documents. It would include using a DOI (Digital Object Identifier) and having an IPR (Intellectual Property Statement - i.e. you own it, can't charge for it). It might be under InterSociety rather than ISDCF.
